

Blues 0 Whitehawk 3

Gordon Boateng's last match in charge at Stortford saw his side crash to a seventh successive home defeat conceding three goals before the break.



The visitors were helped along the way with an early own goal. Tony Lee's corner in the third minute was headed goalwards by Reece Connolly and central defender Tarik Moore-Azille turned the ball past keeper Joe Wright.

There then followed a spell of even play with Evans Kouassi causing a few problems down the Hawks' right flank whilst Jack Masterton was close with a shot just over. Masterton's cross in the 36th minute produced a header from Danny Mills that Wright saved at the foot of an upright. Mills then struck with two goals in three minutes before the interval. Firstly poor defending allowed Ben Strevens to set the frontman in to beat Wright and another error, this time by Paul Rodgers, let in Sergio Torres to provide the pass for Mills to shoot under the Blues' keeper.

On the restart Dominic Green was close for Stortford whilst Mills and Connolly did likewise shortly afterwards at the other end. Mills then blotted his copybook on the hour picking up two yellow cards in the space of a minute to be sent off by referee Ajibola.



Even faced with ten men Stortford were unable to threaten a consolation goal.
