An excellent performance from Blues saw them end the White Tigers' four game winning run and pick up their fourth league victory of the season.

Fielding three debutants and with the mercurial Cliff Akurang on the bench, the Blue Brazil produced an excellent performance to take the three points and make the long journey home a happy one.

It was the visitors who had the first chance of the game when Femi Akinwande got in a strike that required a smart save from Martin Rice.

As the half went on, City started to get into their stride and they took the lead just the half-hour mark when a loose ball from the visitors was seized upon by Niall Thompson who threaded it through to Rocky Neal and he coolly slotted the ball home.

The lead only lasted for seven minutes when Aaron Bentley was penalised for holding Danny Morgan inside the area and the new-boy stepped up to find the net from the spot.

With the game becoming something of a scrappy affair in the early exchanges of the second period, it was the visitors who snatched the win when a low ball into the danger zone from Aaron Green was brilliantly turned into his own net by the unfortunate Bentley to complete a miserable afternoon for the defender. Some good defending from the Blues kept the hosts at bay, and although Thompson fired wide in the dying minutes, the visitors hung on for their third away win of the campaign.
