

# BLUES SLAM GATE TO MOVE OFF BOTTOM

## MARGATE 0 BLUES 3

Blues will make the trip home from Kent with their fourth away win of the campaign after a comfortable win against Margate, on Saturday.

Their biggest victory of the league campaign sees Steve Smith's team move off the bottom of the table, and with fourth of the five sides above them losing, they are now five points short of safety.

Greg Cundle gave Blues a first half lead, before Phil Walsh scored on his debut to make it 2-0 just after the break and Emmanuel Adebawale wrapped things up 20 minutes from time.



Blues took the lead in the 28th minute as a long Johnny Herd throw-in was fumbled by Valery Pajetat before being turned home by former Margate loanee Cundle.

Stortford doubled their advantage just minutes after the break as new signing Walsh, another former Gate player headed home unmarked to set the Blues on their way to a much needed three points.

Ira Jackson had a half chance to reduce the arrears but his fierce shot was pushed away by Harry Voss as the Blues looked for a way back into the game but Blues' fourth away win of the campaign was confirmed in the later stages of the game as the ball was turned home by Adebawale.
